## Senior Driving Checklist

Is it time to take the keys away? For your loved ones to stop driving and look at alternate forms of senior transportation? Here's some questions to ask to see if your parents are a danger to themselves or others on the road. Have them answer these questions honestly so you can determine if they should be driving. For the sake of brevity, we'll refer to the driver as "he". Circle the answer that best applies.

## Vision

1. Has he had an eye exam in the last year? Yes or No
2. Have cataracts, macular degeneration, glaucoma or any eye diseases? Yes or No
3. Have problems seeing signs or lane lines? Yes or No
4. Always wear his glasses when driving? Yes or No
5. Have a clean windshield and good windshield wipers? Yes or No

## Hearing
